## **INTRODUCTION**

International Human Rights & Anti – Corruption Society (hereinafter referred to as The Society with the acronym “IHRAS”) is a Legal, Autonomous and Intermediary Entity standing between the Private Sphere and the State, make demands on State and holds Public Officials accountable during or after tenure of office. The Entity is a Societal Watchdog, a mantra to Societal ill and a Minister in the Temple of Justice with respect to the Rule of Law and Due Process, makes a Periodic Appraisal of Governments, National and International Organizations Performance, that of Individual and Corporate Bodies in term of Security, Social and Economic Responsibilities and Individual Leadership Ingenuity as they affect the Society and Humanity in Particular. The Society is of Observatory Status review with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and submitting it Fact Findings and Quadrennial Reports to the United Nations DESA Events Management System and other Global Human Rights Institutions.

## **ESTABLISHMENT AND LEGALIZATION**

As an International Non-Governmental Organization, Established on 1<sup>st</sup> June 1999, Legalized and Certified on May 23 2007 by the Law of the Federal Republic of Nigeria – Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) Company and Allied Matters Act 1990 to complement and promote the works, goals, mission and objectives of the United Nations, African Union European Union and other International Organizations on Human Rights, Anti-Corruption, Security, Democracy, Labour, Environment and Development.

## **MOTTO**

The Motto of International Human Rights & Anti – Corruption Society is “JUSTICE, ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY”.

## **MANDATES**

The Mandates of the International Human Rights & Anti-corruption Society is set out under its Functions in SECTION 6 of the Society’s Constitution which provides that the Society shall be:-

1. Promoting Transparency & Accountability in the Public and Private Sectors through the enforcement of human rights of Nations’ citizens.
2. Dealing with all matters relating to the promotion of democracy, security, Anti-Corruption and protection of human rights as guaranteed by the Nation Constitution, African and European Charters, the United Nations Charter and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, The International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, The International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights and other International Treaties on Human Rights, Democracy, Anti-Corruption, Security, Labour, Environment and Development to which the Nation is a Signatory or Member
3. Promoting the Works and Activities of United Nations and its UN Specialized Agencies, Functional and Regional Commissions of the United Nations Economic & Social Council.
4. Provision of Charitable, Humanitarian and Social Services to the vulnerable communities, less privileges, physically disadvantaged persons, through International & National Donors.
5. Conducting an Independent Uninfluenced and Undiluted Monitoring & Evaluation, Observations, Investigations, Inquiries and Reporting of all alleged cases of human rights

violations, corruption, insecurity, and make appropriate recommendations to the Government/Authorities for prosecution and sanctions or such other legal actions in the court of law as it may deem expedient in each circumstance.

6. Collaborating, Partnering, Liaising and Cooperating with National and International Organizations on human rights, anti-corruption, security, labour, environment and development for the purpose of advancing the promotion and protection of human rights of citizenry.
7. Demanding, Requesting and Investigating the conduct, or behaviour and management of public officers who misappropriate, mismanage, or divert public funds and property to his or her personal use whenever there is a public outcry, complaints, prayers, and petitions from members of the public.
8. Making effective improvements and assisting of victims of human rights violation and sanctions of the perpetrators.
9. Undertaking studies on all matters relating to human rights, security, anti-corruption, labour, environment and development and assist the government/agencies in the formulation of appropriate policies to guarantee human rights and good governance.
10. Publishing reports on the State of Human Rights, Insecurity, Democracy, Anti-corruption and Development of any Nation.
11. Monitoring, observing, and determining the extent to electoral and election process and procedures of nominating, selecting contestants/candidates of political parties are compliance with their Party Constitutions/Guidelines and Electoral Laws/Guidelines and connect with the Community Agenda and provide timely and accurate reports for the purpose of ascertaining the conformity with the Democratic Values.
12. Assisting Government at all levels and security Agencies in restoring public confidence, develop a culture of human rights, security, anti-corruption, transformation, integrity, accountability and transparency within the Security Agencies and promote good working relationship between the Security Agencies and the People or Community.
13. Intervening in legal proceedings pending in Court or Tribunals are inadmissible by the Society as its are subjudice but in a situation where there is fear by any of the party of miscarriage of justice, the Society shall admit such complaints and conduct a watching brief or enter appearance as interested party through the legal officers of litigation Directorate of the Society, at the end of the proceedings, report is submitted to the Court or Tribunal to aid the Court/Tribunal in arriving at justice in that matter.
14. Attesting on characters of political parties aspirants and candidates to any elected offices and appointed positions to stem off bad characters in which are synonymous to corruption and abuse of human rights of the Nation.
15. Participating in all International Activities relating to the promotion of Democracy, Human Rights Anti- corruption, Security and Development.

16. Promoting Social and Economic Development in the Nations through co-operation library and information network about member Nations.
17. Establish a Remind Home and offer Humanitarian and philanthropy services and cater for less privilege in the Society such as orphans, widows, needy persons teenage pregnant mothers, destitute, disable persons.
18. Instituting Awards and Honour to such Awards and Honours are due
19. Undertaking Seminar, workshops Conferences and Symposiums in the areas of Human Rights, Security, Anti-corruption, Good Governance, Mass mobilization, Economic Development, Environmental issues, labour, human capacity, to solve the Socio-Economic, Socio-political and cultural Awareness and Re-awaking of the Nation using Private and Public Institutions including National, State and Local Government Legislatures.
20. Organizing Local, Regional National and International workshops, seminars and conferences on Human rights issues, fight against corruption, security issues for public enlightenments
21. Assisting Government at all levels in the Management of Security Challenges facing the Nations through effective liaising and procuring of Security Information and make same available to Security Agencies for immediate intervention.
22. Partnering, Collaborating or Liaising with the International Donor Agencies/Organization/Foundations to monitor, supervise and report to achieve the Goals Objectives or Mission of the Donor Agencies for the benefits of the Nations.
23. Integrating Women and Youths into the main stream of Political, Economic, Social and Cultural, rights, Development and Anti-Poverty or Anti eradication.
24. Carrying out Societal Watch-Dog Activities For instance if a Public officer misuses or misappropriate Public Funds, or involve in Human Rights violation and insecurity, the society shall write or notify such complaint against the allege Public Officer or person within 21 days for written explanation or Representation, failure which to respond or react, the Society without any recourse or reminder shall search for justice of that complaints and conduct an Independent and Unbiased Investigation of the complainant and if found to be true and correct, legal redress shall be sought for on behalf of the complainant for the interest of Justice and the Nation.
25. Demanding Public/Private institutions in the Nations to implement their Operational Laws/Constitutions, failure which the Society shall seek for legal redress in the law Courts.
26. Promoting empowerment for women and youths for overall achievements of peaceful co-existence of Nations.
27. Ensuring that the office of Code of Conduct Bureau lives up to public expectations by calling on all the public functionaries at all times to declare their assets.
28. Carrying out all such objectives and Activities as are necessary to serve the humanity.

## **POWER OF THE SOCIETY**

The Society shall have powers to

- (a) Do all things by the Society Constitution
- (b) Do other things as are necessary or expedient for the performance of the Society's Functions under the Society's Constitution.

## **JUSTIFICATION**

International Human Rights and Anti-Corruption Society is what Nation need most, there has been near dam down of law and order, peace and stability in the world. So many countries are ridden with social unrest, killings, vandalism, terrorism, kidnapping, armed robbery, poor education standard, Human Rights Abuses and high rate of Corruption and so many unnamed antisocial vices that makes the citizens to live in fear.

## **MISSION STATEMENT**

Full collaboration, partnership status and Membership are opened to reputable National and International individual, group of persons, foundations, organizations on Human Rights, Anti-Corruption, Security, Democracy, Labour, Environment and Development.

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

The Law covering the Code of Conduct (COC) of all Members and Trustees of Society shall be:

1. Every Member must sincerely fear God and Love Humanity and deeply consent to the "Objectives, Motto", Mission and Vision of the Society in Words and Actions and not to involve in:
  - (a) Bribery and Corruption
  - (b) Abuse of Office e.g

- i. Granting of press interview or publication without clearance from the Society's Director General.
- ii. Using of void languages
- iii. Undue intermingling with the society in terms of dressing, eating or drinking habit in the public.

Any Member or Trustee found to have done anything to bring reproach to the Society directly or indirectly ranging from a, b i, ii & iii shall be terminated from membership by the Society within 48 hours and the Security Document return within 72 hours from the receipt of the termination letter.

#### **LIVING PHILOSOPHY**

### **ELECTION MONITORING AND OBSERVATION**

International Human Rights & Anti – Corruption Society in investigating, observing, monitoring on the conduct of electoral/election process and procedures, the Society is independent from any civil and non-governmental organizations and is obliged to remain neutral and abide by the Declaration Principles for International Election Observation (DPIEO) and Code of Conduct (COC) as well as the Nation Electoral Laws and Constitution, hence the Society outstanding in election monitoring and observation in Nigeria 2011 General Election was accredited as an International Observer to Observe and Report the conduct of the 2011 Nigeria General Election for:

1. National Assembly Election
2. Presidential Election and
3. Governorship/House of Assembly Election

### **NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ELECTION**

The Society observed the National Assembly Election and assessed the conduct of the National Assembly Election which was credible but was not free and fair due to election malpractices, riggings, brutality by fake security Police and Army in some states in Nigeria. ## **GENERAL ASSESSMENT AND COLLATION OF VIEWS IN 2011 ELECTION**

### **1. GENERAL OBSERVATION**

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) tried their best in terms of giving Nigerians free and fair election but many negative politicians in Nigeria are yet to come to terms, realities and believing that election should be rigged, ballot boxes should be snatched, organized fake army and political thugs in most of the polling units. INEC has improved in the electoral process in the right environment. The INEC would have conducted the best election in the world because INEC was opened to all the contestants and provided a level playing field but the politicians were the caused of the abused and the society suggested and recommended that:

1. Politicians should be educated as the new order of conducting election in Nigeria where people vote counts.
2. The fake security agents should be discouraged and prosecuted in the court of justice to serve as deterrent to others while the Security Agents should be harness and refocused so that they can always react properly when there is a report of electoral violence, rigging etc.
3. All the Electoral offenders should be punished not minding who is involved.
4. All reports concerning the violation of electoral process by either the Security Agents or INEC officials should be thoroughly investigated by INEC and the culprit/offenders be punished to serve as deterrent to others.
5. Any politician who was using fake police/soldiers for the election process be investigated by the INEC as this is a serious criminal offence because it constitute impersonation, political thuggery etc.

### **2. FOR INDEPENDENT NATIONAL ELECTORAL COMMISSION (INEC) OBSERVATION**

No election could be rigged without connivance with INEC adhoc staff, the rule of law and election guideline are very clear and states that Accreditation must be done within a time frame, thereafter the accredited voters will stand on queue and be counted and announce to the hearing of every voter as the number of accredited voters in that unit. Thereafter voting will commence and the Presiding Officer (PO) shall issue stamped ballot papers to voters who shall vote and wait for the counting and announcement of the result. But unfortunately, this guidelines were not followed in

most of the polling units and that was why politicians in connivance with the INEC Adhoc staff/security agents snatch away the ballot papers/boxes.

### **3. FOR ELECTORATES OBSERVATION**

The electorate also have their own share of blame because they compromise their conscience and rights for the little money given to them by the politicians and there were not also vigilant. The INEC guideline had provided for the electorate to protect their rights, but non of the voters exhibited or committed in protecting their right. The electorate clam to be too busy and unable to understand their full right of electing a leader of their choice. Also the electorate also fail to understand their rights and importance of electing a leader of their choice. That is what their did not know that their were performing a very important civil rights that is why their did not protect their rights

## **SOCIETY'S MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE**

### **1. BOARD OF TRUSTEES (BOT)**

These are people of proven integrity and Ministers in the Temple of God and Justice, constituted to enable the smooth pursuits of all the set Aims and Objectives and responsible for Policy Formation of the Society whose Names Appeared on the Society's Incorporation Certificate by the Legal Authority for the Registration of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

### **2. INTERNATIONAL DIRECTORS (ID)**

These are men and women of good characters and high repute who shall be nominated and appointed as International Director and whose names shall appear in the Corporate Profile of the Society and to represent their countries in the Society, assist the Society to achieve its Aims and Objectives, Policy Formation and serve as International Representatives for linkages, collaboration and co-operation with individual(s) International Organizations with the aim of helping and providing for Technical and Financial Aids (Grants) to solve the Social Problems of citizenry, humanity and implementing the Aims and Objectives of the Society's.

### **3. NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (NEC)**

The NEC is composed of the Chairman who is the Society's Director General, Secretary General, Asst. Secretary, Director of Legal and 14 Directors who are Professionals in the following Directorates of the Society's interest:

- i. Human Rights & Anti Corruption
- ii. Security, investigation and Intelligence
- iii. Legal and litigation
- iv. Monitoring & Evaluation, Observation & Reporting
- v. International Affairs, Economic Co-operation and Development
- vi. Policy Implementation & Development

- vii. Democracy & Good Governance
- viii. Developments
- ix. Public Affairs & Information
- x. Human Resources & Development
- xi. Planning, Research and Statistics
- xii. Environment
- xiii. Labour
- xiv. Administration & Finance

#### **4. NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL CHANCELLORS (NIC)**

These are men and women of substance whose trust and spirited ideology with the Aims and Objectives of the Society is to function as Special Advisers and contribute for technical and financial aids of the Society and create linkages and collaboration with National and International Organizations for Technical and Financial Aids/Grants to promote the Aims and Objective of the Society for the benefits of citizenry and humanity.

#### **5. REGIONAL, STATE AND GRASSROOT'S COORDINATORS (RSGC)**

These are appointed to create access to urgent access to the operational services of the Society.

#### **6. GENERAL ASSEMBLY (GA)**

This is the Annual Assembly comprising of all the Structural Organs namely:- Board of Trustees (BOT), International Directors (ID), National Executive Council (NEC), National & International Chancellors (NIC), Regional, State and Grassroots Coordinators and all Members of the Society.

#### **STAFF**

These are the personnel and officers employed either on Part, full time or voluntary Basis by the Society to aid in the Administrative facilitation of the Activities and Affairs of the Society.

#### **COMPLAINTS MANAGEMENT**

##### **PROCEDURES FOR SUBMITTING AND RECEIVING COMPLAINTS:**

All complaints in writings can be submitted either by E-mail, speed post or physically and to be addressed to the Director General of the Society also can be submitted through the Society's website by simply Completing COMPLAINT FORM available on Site.

##### **1. WHO MAY COMPLAIN:**

- (i) Any person or group of persons/Organizations are entitled to lodge of human rights violation, corruption and insecurity with the Society.
- (ii) Any person(s) acting on behalf of another person(s) who cannot act in his/her/their own behalf is eligible to complain.
- (iii) Any Association(s) person(s), group of person(s) acting in the interest of his/her/their members/associations on their own either by writing or orally to the Society.

##### **2. COMPLAINTS BY THIRD PARTIES**

Any victim or the person(s) against whom the alleged violation is made is not in a position to lodge a complaint, Third Parties who may include relations, friends, legal representatives or concerned person(s)/non governmental organization(s) may lodge the complaint on his/her behalf.

### **3. CLASS ACTIONS**

Any person, individual(s) or association(s) affected by Human Rights violations, corruption and insecurity is able to complain not only on his/her/their own behalf, but also on behalf of others who are also affected.

### **4. SUO MOTTO (Society's Initiated Complaints)**

The International Human Rights & Anti-Corruption Society has jurisdiction to initiate Independent Uninfluenced and Undiluted Investigations or Inquires into possible situation and alleged cases of Human Rights violations, corruption and Insecurity against any person without receiving a formal complaint or invitation from any person(s) or quarters.

### **5. INTERVENING IN LEGAL PROCEEDINGS**

The matters pending in Court or Tribunals are inadmissible by the Society as its are subjudice but in a situation where there is fear by any of the party of miscarriage of justice, the Society shall admit such complaints and conduct a watching brief or enter appearance as interested party through the legal officers of litigation Directorate of the Society, at the end of the proceedings, report is submitted to the Court or Tribunal to aid the Court/Tribunal in arriving at justice in that matter.

### **CONTRACTUAL LIABILITY**

The Society is a body corporate with perpetual succession and can sue or be sued in its corporate name – International Human Rights & Anti-Corruption Society with power to acquire, hold and alienate property, enter into agreement and to do all things necessary to carry out its Aims and Objectives and defend its members property and reputation.

### **ENFORCEMENT OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS ON BEHALF OF THE VICTIM IN COURTS**

1. The Society in line with its mandate, has investigated a case of human rights violations and arson reported to the Society by physically disadvantage person Mr. Efiok Isuguyo (see the photograph) Mbat Esifon Village, Obot Akara Local Government Area, Akwa Ibom State of Nigeria whom Mr. Efiok Isuguyo approached all the police when his dwelling house was set on fire, all his property damaged but Police paid negative attention because the perpetrators were politicians with economic powers.

The Society investigated the complaints and found it to be true and correct and therefore reported the commission of crime to the Asst. Inspector General of Police (AIG), Nigeria Police Force Zone 6, Calabar for arrest and prosecution. The Police Zone 6, Calabar investigated the Society recommendations and fund all to be true and correct and arraigned the culprits in court where the culprit went to Court and sued the physical disadvantaged man Mr. Efiok Isug Uyo and the International Human Right & anti- corruption society Director General Dr. Udofia for Enforcement of Fundamental Rights at the High Court I Ikot Ekpene Akwa Ibom State. The Society legal & litigation Directorate defended the cripple man in the court and obtained Justice where the court struck out the application file by the culprits against the Victim. The court ordered the police to arrest and prosecute the culprits for Arson, violations the Right of the physically disadvantage person Mr. Efiok Isunguyo. The court also congratulated the international Human Rights & Anti- corruption Society for protecting the poor downturn in Africa.

2. The Society has won in the Federal High Court at Calabar on the enforcement of Fundamental Right which the Court Ordered the Police to arrest and prosecute the petroleum leader at Ikot Ekpene, Akwa Ibom State for selling adulterated petroleum and adjustment of meter to extort money from members of the public which amount to violation of human rights, crime

and corruption and congratulated the Society for protecting the citizens and promoting the fight against corruption in Nigeria which no NGO has been able to do.
